MINUTES

The Spring Lake Neighborhood Association convened its general membership meeting on Saturday, May 10, 2008 at Monsignor Gauthreaux Center of St. Maria Goretti Catholic Church. The meeting was called to order at 10:15 a.m. and president Bunny Vallon, presided.

The treasurer's report was given by Fay Wooten. Motion moved to accept the treasurer's report by Aaron Daste and seconded by Phil Reed.

Bunny read a report from a meeting with Mayor Ray Nagin. In that report, she noted that according to Mayor Nagin, about 71% of the people are back. Approximately 2,000 to 3,000 people are moving back each month. Money is flowing in the city -- 90% of sales tax is up. The tourist industry is doing extremely well. The Veterans Administration Hospital is in the process of increasing its capacity to hold more beds. There was also discussion of a Business Park in our area. Lake Kenilworth is for sale at \$3 million -- paid \$1 million. The professional building will be closed down. Renovation of the Milner playground will take place as well.
